## OAK CANYON RESERVOIR PROJECT – PUBLIC OUTREACH PROGRAM UPDATE

The public outreach program in support of the Oak Canyon Reservoir Project continues with various strategies in progress and planned. Activities completed since the March 28, 2011 TSD Board meeting include:

- Establishment of a dedicated Project Information Hotline (818-889-8996).
- Development of a Project Fact Sheet (copy attached). Please note that this is an initial version of the Fact Sheet – as the project progresses, the document will be updated. Staff provided a supply for the 4/16/11 Oak Park EarthFest event.
- Creation of an Oak Canyon Project page on the TSD website. This, too, will be updated and expanded as the project progresses.
- Finalization of a date for the groundbreaking event: (Thursday, June 9, 2011).

Concerning the groundbreaking event, staff needs direction from your Board with regard to the following:

- Desired location of the event (as of the date of this letter, two Board members had expressed a preference for the site in Oak Canyon Park, and one member stated a preference for the site on Kanan Road);
- Time of the event;
- Agenda (speakers, ceremonial turning of dirt, refreshments (if desired), etc.);
- Invitation list.


In addition to planning for the groundbreaking event, the following outreach activities are scheduled for May:

# *Oak Canyon Reservoir*

---

## Project Fact Sheet

---

Triunfo Sanitation District, owner and operator of Oak Park Water Service, has embarked on a major water system improvement project: construction of a new water storage tank in the hills east of Lindero Canyon Road and north of Kanan Road (see site map on reverse). The 2.1 million-gallon tank, to be named the Oak Canyon Reservoir, will significantly increase water storage capacity for the community. This fact sheet is designed to answer frequently asked questions about the project. ### *Frequently Asked Questions*

**Q: Why is a new storage reservoir needed?**

A: The Oak Canyon Reservoir will replace an existing tank located near Conifer Street and Conifer Circle. Seismic studies have revealed that this tank (known as the Conifer Tank) sits on an old landslide. Built in 1966, its foundation is not suitable for seismic retrofitting. The Oak Canyon Reservoir will have twice the storage capacity as the Conifer Tank.

**Q: When will construction begin and how long will it last?**

A: Construction is scheduled to start by summer 2011 and be completed approximately a year later.

**Q: What are the scheduled hours of construction?**

A: Construction activity is scheduled to begin no earlier than 7:00 a.m. and end no later than 7:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

**Q: How will construction of the tank affect nearby neighborhoods and streets?**

A: The actual tank construction site is located in the hills, away from homes and streets. However, traffic on Kanan Road, between Golden Eagle Drive and Los Arcos Drive, will be delayed briefly from time to time to enable trucks and other equipment to access the construction site by means of a fire road. Installation of pipeline, valves, and a control facility may also affect traffic on Kanan periodically. Every effort will be made to keep delays to a minimum.

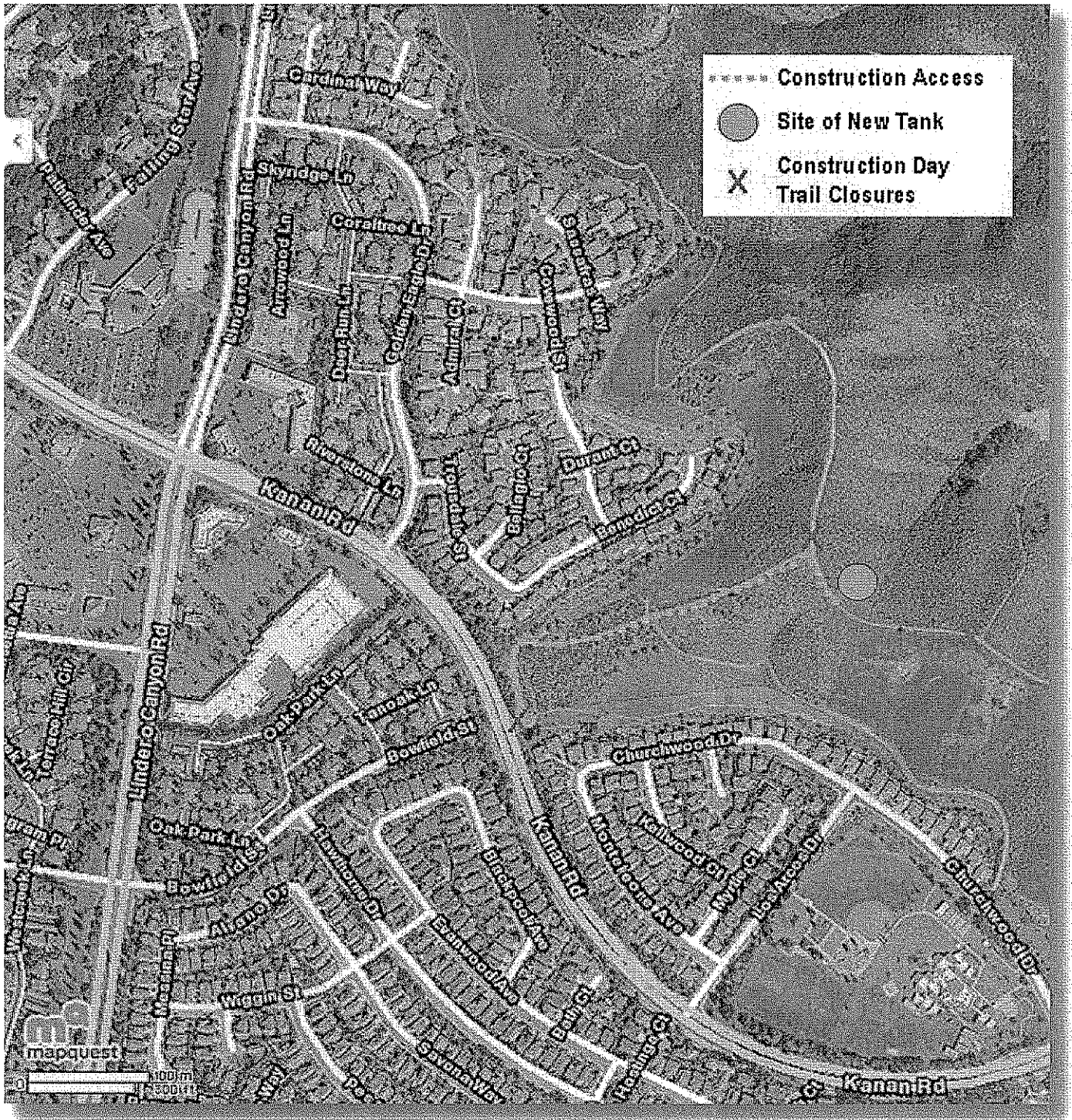
**Q: Will access to trails in the area be affected?**

A: For safety reasons, trails in the immediate vicinity of the construction site will be closed during construction hours (see map on reverse for closure locations). All trails will be accessible before and after construction hours and on weekends.

**Q. How visible will the new tank be from surrounding areas?**

A. Constructed of pre-stressed concrete, the new reservoir will be buried underground; thus, visibility from nearby neighborhoods will be minimal.
