## CONSERVATION PROGRAM

On September 2, 2010, the Calleguas Municipal Water District (Calleguas) announced that with persistent uncertainties regarding water supplies that the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) will extend their Water Supply Allocation Plan (WSAP) Level 2 allocation through June 30, 2011. Based on the current outlook of the water supply the MWD board at its April 12, 2011 meeting decided to terminate the existing WSAP level 2 allocation as of April 13, 2011 including water supply allocations and to not implement their level 2 allocation in FY 12. Oak Park Water met the water supply allocation through the use of public outreach and enforcement of the water waste restrictions in Ordinance TSD-66. Attached is Oak Park Water's allocation report for May 2011 for your information.

In 2009 the State adopted the Water Conservation Act of 2009 (SBx7-7) requiring urban water retailers to meet a goal of reducing water usage 20% by 2020. The goal for Oak Park Water is stated in the 2010 Urban Water Management Plan. Staff is developing a monthly report to compare Oak Park's water usage to the new goal.

<sup>1</sup> Total Water Supply Estimated Target is the sum of the monthly target for purchases from CMWD and the estimated groundwater target. Monthly targets for purchases from CMWD were calculated using average purchases for each month during the Allocation Base Years (2004-2006) expressed as a percentage of annual average purchases and applying those percentages to the annual allocation for FY 2011 to arrive at monthly purchase targets.

<sup>2</sup> Please note that this simplified formula does not take into account changes in the proportionate mix of groundwater and imported water, which may result in MWD penalties even when the total deliveries are on target. Final purveyor allocations will be reconciled at the end of the Allocation Year and possibly adjusted based on actual local production and any applicable appeals. Through the reconciliation process, Calleguas will coordinate with Metropolitan to ensure agency allocations are not adversely affected due to documented extraordinary production, loss of supply, etc.
